

Integrated undergraduate and graduate university study of philosophy and theology is completed by:

- passing all the exams,
- writing a graduation thesis and
- passing a comprehensive final exam.

A comprehensive final exam assesses the achieved outcomes of the study program, and it consists of three parts: writing a graduation thesis (application of the acquired knowledge and skills), defending the thesis (explaining the adopted deliberations and conclusions) and an oral exam that includes theses from 7 (seven) areas of philosophy and theology (presentation of the adopted knowledge).

Upon completion of the study the student, if they fully utilised the advantages and opportunities of education that the Faculty provides, will be able to:

1. Understand and present the content and the act of Christian faith, that is, the revelation of the Triune God in Jesus Christ.
2. Analyse fundamental philosophical questions and apply philosophical insights to theology, but also to transformative understanding of the overall reality and society.
3. Synthesize and actualize the contents, origins, basic methods of interpretation and the theological message of the Scriptures.
4. Present and analyse the theological development of the Catholic Church in history, its most important councils and dogmas, and to compare and connect the role of the Catholic Church with the entire Western European culture and with other cultures.
5. In an interdisciplinary way synthesize knowledge, and critically understand and explain basic contents of philosophical, historical, biblical, systematic and practical theology, canon law and educational disciplines.
6. Know the fundamentals of sacramentology and indicate the fundamental importance of sacramental life, the sacramental support in family pastoral care and in critical existential situations and in the overall pastoral activity.
7. Transmit the acquired knowledge, skills, principles and methods of Christian education and counselling in different vocations of humanistic orientation and in the overall social context.
8. Promote the culture of dialogue in a pluralistic society, especially the ecumenical and inter-religious dialogue.
9. Use church documents and basic theological literature from various sources in Croatian and at least one foreign language and apply the appropriate scientific methodology in the preparation of scientific papers.
10. In the light of Christian faith in the Triune God and on the bases of Christian humanism, to independently reflect the overall reality and make interpersonal and general social (systemic) guidelines for the promotion of the dignity of human person and the understanding of Christian conception of spirit, freedom, responsibility, fairness, peace and prosperity.
11. Accept a socio-political responsibility based on the Christian worldview and in dialogue with other worldviews.
12. Represent the Christian vision of marriage and family, provide and assist in marriage and family counselling.
13. Provide spiritual, therapeutic and moral assistance in the development of responsible individuals in correctional facilities.
14. Promote the social doctrine of the Church in charitable institutions and social welfare institutions.

15. Make responsible decisions in hospital ethics committees.

16. Promote Christian worldview in the media.

Recognize the importance and the need for lifelong learning and training.
