Learning outcomes	After successfully completing the course, the student will be able to: 1. Define and explain the fundamental concepts and principles of the Catholic moral teaching and its cognitive-ontological status, in particular the concepts of good-evil, the moral norm, the moral law, the natural moral law, freedom - <i>knowledge</i> . 2. Understand and interpret the knowledge of fundamental ethical principles in the light of the natural law and Christian revelation - <i>application</i> and <i>understanding</i> . 3. Discuss the present crisis of personal and social morality in relation to the fundamental principles of Catholic morality - <i>reaction</i> . 4. Distinguish certain ethical trends that developed through history in Catholic theology, and which to a degree correspond to some contemporary principles in the Catholic moral theology: Augustinianism, Scotism, voluntarism, nominalism, Thomism - <i>attitudes</i> and <i>beliefs</i> . 5. Evaluate the meaning and significance of human freedom and judge their own value system with the fundamental principles of the Catholic moral teaching - <i>adopting values</i> . 6. Put into relation the Catholic moral positions in relation to other (non-Catholic) moral systems – <i>organization of values</i> . 7. Identify the specificity of Catholic moral teaching and use it in the moral assessment of specific life situations – <i>skills and abilities</i> .
